Message from our Pastor:

Hello good people of the Richmond Cluster parishes!

So last Monday was the Solemnity of the Assumption. The glorious feast day wherein we commemorate Mary's being assumed into heaven, body and soul. In almost all cases, this is a Holy Day of Obligation...which means we are supposed to go to Mass. We (myself and the staff) simply figured that it was a Holy Day of Obligation like it almost always is. As such, we announced it as such and adjusted the Mass schedule. Well...whoops! It in fact was not a Holy Day of obligation this year. For only this year, because it fell on a Monday, it was optional.

We have many who struggle to make ends meet. We have many who suffer mental and physical crosses every day. At the same time, we have so much to be thankful for. We have the blessings of health in our families. We have the blessings of new life and new relationships and family members. We have the ability to go to work and earn a living and provide for our needs and the needs of our loved ones. We have very, very, very many things to be thankful for.
