Other translations say he "rejoiced in the Spirit" and said "I give praise to you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, for although you have hidden these things from the wise and learned you have revealed them to little ones."

Have you ever heard the saying "if you want to make God laugh, tell him your plans?" That is basically true.

Jesus laughed in the Gospel today because people who think they get it and have it all figured out do not, but people who are little and small and simple, they get it.
