Hello all,

Two items I would like to mention today.

First, as many of you already know, there has been a change in plans: Fr Frank will NOT be leaving. I am sorry for the confusion. Things have changed and it was determined they are going another route. Like I said, sorry for the confusion. We just have to roll with it, ya know!?! Fr. Frank is here to stay.

So since he will not be transferred, ALL MASS SCHEDULES WILL STAY AS THEY HAVE BEEN. NO CANCELATION OR CHANGES OF ANY MASSES. We will still have the Saturday Vigil Mass at St Patrick at 530pm, as well as the regular daily Mass schedule at St John, and follow a three week rotation. Thanks for staying flexible!

Secondly I would like to comment on the tragedy in Las Vegas. It is incomprehensibly awful what happened. I cannot imagine the sorry those are experiencing who have been affected by this. I pray God gives them great faith, so they know there is an afterlife and in it God makes all things blessed and peaceful.

But I want to offer one other thought. These events are becoming very, very common in our country and in our world. And with the prevalence of news surrounding us, we seem to hear about these evil acts almost every week, if not more.

My word of caution is to not become numb to this. Do not let this become 'normal.' It becomes 'normal' when we just sort of shrug it off and say 'well that's the way things are now.' That cannot be the case.

We certainly have to push-on and not let evil cause us to despair or to live in fear, for then evil would have won. But we have to stop for a moment and consider one of our own kids or brothers being at that concert and being killed. How utterly changed forever are the lives of every single person who loved one of those many people who died that day. Their lives will always be different because of that awful action.

We don't want to become numb. Because then it becomes the new normal. And it is not.
