## Message from our Pastor:

Hello all!

As you all know, our own Father Danny is being transferred August 1. I am very happy for him, although I will miss him. I joked in my homily last week, as I was talking about all the little things that people we live with do that annoy us: I said living with Fr Danny is sort of like living with a saint...he never does anything annoying!

I am very grateful for his work this past year. Father Danny has been very helpful in serving the needs of these parishes. He is faithful and reverent in administering the Sacraments, reliable when given an important responsibility, and never beyond helping with even trivial/mundane but necessary tasks. I know he will make a great pastor. But pray for him, because he will have a great deal of responsibility.

We were going to have a 1-year anniversary party for him at St Peter on June 30<sup>th</sup> at St Peter at 6:30pm. BUT, since he is moving we are going to make it a COMBINED ANNIVERSARY/GOING AWAY PARTY. Please join us to celebrate his one-year anniversary as well as wish him well as he moves to this new assignment. Also, one thing about today. Today, had it fallen on a weekday, is the feast day of St Josemaria Escriva, an amazing saint who in 1928 founded a group called Opus Dei (meaning 'work of God'). It is a personal prelature in the Church, a religious organization with over 90,000 members. 98% of its members are lay and 2% a priests.

It is a wonderful organization that has as its special focus the sanctification of our daily labors. Whether it be washing dishes, cleaning toilets, performing brain surgery, typing at a computer...its tenets hold that holiness and sanctification can be found through these tasks, when done in the right spirit and for the right reasons. This is not a new concept in the Church, but it one that this group has wonderfully highlighted.

St Josemaria wrote a great book called "The Way." It's full of excellent quotes. He was tough but truthful. I leave you with a few quotes of his.

"Understand this well: there is something holy, something divine hidden in the most ordinary situations, and it is up to each one of you to discover it"

"I assure you, my children, that when a Christian carries out with love the most insignificant everyday action, that action overflows with the transcendence of God. That is why I have told you so often, and hammered away at it, that the Christian vocation consists in making heroic verse out of the prose of each day. Heaven and earth seem to merge, my children, on the horizon. But where they really meet is in your hearts, when you sanctify your everyday lives..."

"Either we learn to find the Lord in the ordinary everyday life or else we shall never find him"

"Don't say, 'That person bothers me.' Think: 'That person sanctifies me'."

"To defend his purity, Saint Francis of Assisi rolled in the snow, Saint Benedict threw himself into a thorn bush, and Saint Bernard plunged into an icy pond... You - what have you done?"

"You always leave the Rosary for later, and you end up not saying it at all because you are sleepy. If there is no other time, say it in the street without letting anybody notice it. It will, moreover, help you to have presence of God."

"You don't know how to pray? Put yourself in the presence of God, and as soon as you have said, 'Lord, I don't know how to pray!' you can be sure you have already begun."

"You're bored? That's because you keep your senses awake and your soul asleep."

"Compromise is a word found only in the vocabulary of those who have no will to fight."

"You need a heart which is in love, not an easy life, to achieve happiness."

"All the things that are now worrying you can be put into a smile which shows your love of God."

"Put your heart aside. Duty comes first. But when fulfilling your duty, put your heart into it. It helps."

"Temptation is necessary to make us realize that we are nothing in ourselves"
