There will be visiting priests as well. Every Saturday before the Mass, at 4:30pm, at St Patrick and St John, a priest is available for confessions. Monday through Friday, confessions can be made at St Peter at 11:45am, before daily Mass. On Good Friday, confessions will be heard at St Peter from noon until 3pm.

As such, there are tons of opportunities to go to confession before Easter. PLEASE GO!!! The Church makes it a requirement to go at least once per year...because it is good for us...like going in for your yearly physical.
