Message from our Pastor:

Good day everyone and Happy 4th of July!!!

The 4th of July is an American holiday. We celebrate our birthday, our independence day as a country. Many people sacrificed their lives so that we could live in the country we live in and have the many blessings we are afforded by living in the United States.

As Christians, as Catholics, we love our country even though we obviously love our God and our faith first and foremost. We love especially those things about our country that enhance or encourage the functioning of our spiritual and religious life. To the extent that laws and cultures of the United States allow us and even encourage us to seek God and live good and virtuous lives, as God would have us do, then those laws and cultures are to be applauded. To the extent that laws and cultures of the United States inhibit our ability to pursue God through our religious practices, then we reject those laws and cultures. This is because God obviously takes precedence in our lives above all else. Obedience to divine laws, to God, is what pleases God...who has the keys to Heaven. Our allegiance is first and foremost to Him and His Church, which we are part of a baptized believers, as Catholic Christians.
