Message from our Pastor:

St Thomas Aquinas is arguably the most significant theologian in the history of the Church. He is called the "angelic" doctor.

Do you know what he says is the opposite of pride?

Most people would say humility. But in fact, he says that it is **thanksgiving**. Being thankful for what you have been given reminds the soul that what it has comes from without, not from within, thus there is no possibility of egocentric feelings (pride).

Thanksgiving is a few days away. I am thankful for being a priest. It is the satisfaction of my life. Especially saying Mass and hearing Confessions. I am thankful for my amazing parents and siblings. I am thankful for these three parishes that God has entrusted to my care. I am thankful for my ancestors who gave up everything to come to this country to offer a better life for me. I am thankful for all the priests and religious sisters who have given their lives in service to God so that the faith was communicated to me. I am thankful for my brother priests who labor in the vineyard every day. I am thankful for lay people who offer their lives in service to the Church with little or no earthly compensation. I am thankful for people who stand up for their Christian faith despite the growing anti-Christian bigotry in the world. I am thankful for the men and women of the United Stated Armed Forces who give up their lives, physically, so that the virtues of this country might be maintained. I am thankful for being able to run up and down the hills in Richmond (it is a lot harder than the flat land of Hampton Roads). I am thankful for the opportunity to eat too much on Thanksgiving, although I will try to not do so. I am thankful that I have a half-dozen old boilers and air conditioners in these old churches that continually break down but nonetheless keep me comfortable. I am even thankful for the brown water that sometimes comes out of the faucet here in the city of Richmond which reminds me that most of the time I have as much clean water as I could ever need. I am thankful for the homeless that are on nearly every corner here in the city; I am not thankful that they are homeless but I am thankful that they are there to remind me of how easy it is to be charitable as God would have me be.

But more than anything else, I am thankful to the Lord, who bled and died for me that my sins might be forgiven and I might be able to worship Him forever in Heaven.

Remember, "Eucharist" means "thanksgiving," it's a Greek. Every Mass we give thanks to God. Every good and perfect gift comes down from Heaven from God. We have nothing good that He has not given us.
