## Message from our Pastor:

Happy Second Sunday of Advent! I am excited for Christmas and the coming of our Savior!

In addition to it being the Second Sunday of Advent, today is also the feast day of St. Nicholas (December 6).

That's right...Santa Claus!

Did you know that St Nicholas is actually a real person? He lived around 320 AD and was a Bishop. He was born a Catholic and had very wealthy parents. But his parents died when he was young, so he was raise by his uncle. He was very wealthy as he inherited his parent's wealth.

He was a very holy Bishop, extraordinarily generous and performed many miracles. One story about him was that he was at the Council of Nicaea in 325AD (which was an ecumenical council of the Church...Vatican II was the most recent ecumenical council ending in 1965), and actually slapped the leading opponent to the orthodox doctrine of the Church during the meeting! Oh the drama...

One thing St. Nicholas shows us by the witness of his life is the two-fold benefit of self-denial. St. Nicholas used to deny himself food on Wednesdays and Fridays, except for one meal. In exchange, he would give the money he would have spent to those in need. This has a two-fold effect. The first, the self-denial increased his love and zeal for God...he became more hungry for God. Second, he helped those in need and thus pleased God. All self-denial is able to accomplish these two goals, increase love for God and help those in need, thus pleasing God. It is very simple.

In today's terms, if you figure two meals cost about \$15, times twice per week (Wed and Fri), that's about \$30 extra we could give per week to whoever is in need, by adopting his habit. We receive the benefit of increasing our love for God and pleasing God. Also, as I have heard it said, we get to take anything we give away with us to Heaven.

So be sure to teach your loved ones about the **real** St. Nicholas. He might not come down your chimney, but he is Heaven showing you with the gift of his prayers, hoping we will follow his example and be with him there one day forever.
