It is through the generosity of donors that we are able to complete the soul-saving and body healing work done each week. The top number shows the total budgeted income as of the most recent weekend. This is the amount of donations we have budgeted that we need to have collected thus far this year based on previous years' expenses. The second number is the actual donations we have received thus far this year. The difference between the two is the amount that actual donations fall short of needed income per our budget. As of the most recent weekend, we are 1/3 of the way through the current year, and have donations which are \$10,399 less than what is needed per our budget. Please continue to be as generous as your means allow, that we might alleviate this shortfall.
