Message from our Pastor:

Happy Advent everyone! I hope everyone had a great week as we speed along to welcome our Savior's coming to us this Christmas. That is what Advent is for.

Advent is a time to double-down on our love for God, to become excited for the most wonderful event that ever happened to us, to get ready to receive the greatest gift we will every receive at Christmas, the birth of God in a man, the birth of Jesus.

Jesus is the reason for the season. All the joy and happiness we experience this season as we look forward to Christmas would all be shallow, empty and ultimately end in utter disappointment if it were not backed up by the God's love for humanity as shown by Him taking on human flesh.

Jesus is the best gift, the gift that keeps on giving, the gift that will never be outdone.

But since it is his birthday, we should get him something. It is rude to go to a birthday party and be empty-handed.

But what do you get a guy who can do anything, who can make a planet from nothing, who has millions of angels at his every beck and call, who rides on clouds, wears a diamond crown and lives in a mansion made of gold (as Revelation tells us)?

There is one thing God wants for Christmas from each of us. He can deal with the stinky manger he had to put up with when he was born. He can deal with the insects, the farm animals, the hay he had to lay on. None of that would turn him off or stop him from coming.

But there is one thing that will hinder him coming this Christmas. There is one thing that will slow him in coming among us...and it has nothing to do with these physical, external discomforts...

The only thing that can hinder God coming among us this Christmas are unprepared hearts.

Unprepared hearts are unwelcoming...and they are the only thing God is slow to enter.

Alternatively, we can prepare our hearts with relative ease. God takes even our smallest efforts at trying to become ready and says "good enough, here I come!!!"

We can spend a little more time in prayer. We can read the daily readings from Mass. We can attend daily Mass occasionally. We can be a little more generous with our wealth. These are all good things that we can intentionally do to prepare for God's coming this Christmas, all of which He greatly delights in.

But the best thing I can think of to do, in order to prepare our hearts for Christmas, is go to Confession with a priest. Confession, like no other thing, makes our hearts a dwelling for God.

God understands our struggle in the world, after all, he lived it as well. That is why he gave us a way to start over, to calm our hearts from the stresses of this life by confessing our sins.

There are tons of places to confess this Advent. We have confessions every Saturday 4:30pm at St Patrick and St John, every day 11:45am at St Peter, as well as anytime, just ask a priest.

We also are having a penance service at St John on Tuesday December 6^{th} at 6:30pm with multiple priests to hear confessions.

I have never met a person who regretted going to confession. It is very good for us, for our hearts.
