MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR:

Did you know that all the money you have is going to be dissolved away? Whether you have plenty of it or just a few dollars to your name, every single dollar is going to be dissolved away. And not just for you, but for everyone. Everyone's money is going to be dissolved away. The CEO of Amazon recently became the richest person in the world. He has over 100 billion dollars. Did you know that even with all that money, he cannot stop what will inevitably happen to every single dollar he has? It will be dissolved away.

What about your dream home? Do you live in your dream home? Are you working so that one day you can live in your dream home? I personally love beautiful and architecturally ornate homes and buildings. And my hobby is home remodeling. I love remodeling rooms, knocking down walls, giving dated fixtures a face-lift. But did you know that even our lovely homes are going to be dissolved away. It's not going to be something you can prevent with a smoke alarm. Your home is gone. It will be dissolved away, so will everything inside it...all the furniture, the big TV, the antiques, dust...it's all going to be dust.

Finally, although this isn't Lent, we also remember the words we hear when we get ashes on Ash Wednesday, "remember you are dust and to dust you will return." Even our own bodies will turn to dust. No matter how many years we may have ahead of us (or not) our bodies will be dust.

In fact, everything will be turning to dust folks. Science cannot stop it. Computers cannot stop it. Doctors cannot stop it and you cannot buy, bargain or cheat your way out of it.

The reason I know this is because the bible says "the elements will be dissolved by fire...everything is to be dissolved" (from the second reading at Mass this weekend). Like I said, everything is going to be turning to dust.

Some people might see this as frightening or a reason to dread. I don't. I see it as the great equalizer. I see it as the great reset button for all of existence. This time for hitting the reset button is called in the bible 'the day of the Lord.' When Jesus comes, it all goes to dust.

The bible also says 2 other things related to this dissolving of everything. It says "everything done on it [earth] will be found out" and "since everything is to be dissolved in this way, what sort of person ought you to be."

What that means is that when all this stuff gets dissolved away, and the 'day of the Lord' comes, everything that everyone has ever done is going to be 'found out.' It's going to be like back in the early church when they used to have public confession. People think it's hard to go to confession now...they should have lived in the early church when you used to go to confession in front of the whole church.

Well there is one more big public confession we all have to go to. It happens on the day of the Lord. Because of this, that's why the next phrase says "since" this is going to happen, "what sort of person ought you be." If everything is going to be known, what type of person should I be now knowing that everything I do will be brought to light? If I do a lot of shady, underhanded things, the day of the Lord is going to be pretty embarrassing. But if behind closed doors I am faithful, full of devotion and love for God, moral and decent, well then all those little acts of kindness and sacrifice that I did without anyone knowing, will then come to light. And the day of the Lord will be a joy.
