Message from our Pastor:

"Do not get drunk on wine, in which lies debauchery, but be filled with the Spirit."

This is a quote from our second reading.

St Paul says don't get drunk on wine but rather be filled with the Holy Spirit. And don't try and be a smart-aleck and say, "well does that mean we can get drunk on bourbon and beer, just so long as it's not wine?" No, I am sorry that is not what it means.

Alcohol is an interesting topic because, on the one hand, we can look around and see the terrible effects that drunkenness and alcoholism have had on men and women, families and whole towns and societies. I am sure we all know someone or many someone's whose lives have been ruined or at least very negatively influenced by alcohol. As so it would seem like an evil thing.

And yet, we cannot deny that Jesus himself made wine for others. Jesus multiplied the wine, or rather, he turned wine into water at the wedding at Cana. Additionally, elsewhere in the Bible, St Paul says (the same person speaking in the above quotation from the second reading) 'drink some wine, it is good for your stomach.'

So how do we deal with this? Where do we draw the line?

The line is loosely defined as 'drunkenness.' It is not a sin to use alcohol. It is a sin to get drunk. When a person gets drunk, he/she voluntarily gives up the most prized possession, the thing that distinguishes them from animals, they give up their reason.

A drunk person temporarily gives up his reason, his ability to think rationally, and becomes animal-like. Once reason is gone, awful acts of indiscretion always follow. That's called debauchery...that is why St Paul says, 'don't get drunk...in which lies debauchery.'

He says rather that for Christians, be filled with the Spirit. A Christian has another way to relieve stress as opposed to drinking, to 'take the edge off.' It's called the Holy Spirit.

When a Christian prays to the Holy Spirit and the Holy Spirit infills them, they receive all the benefits that come from drinking alcohol, but in a purer form. For example, people get more confident once they get infilled with the Holy Spirit (which is something people like about getting drunk). People become more at peace and happy once infilled with the Holy Spirit (which is another reason people like to get drunk). People feel like they can say and think what they like when they a filled with the Holy Spirit (which people like to do once they get drunk). People are more easily able to relate to others once they are filled with the Holy Spirit (which people love about getting drunk). And the list goes one.

Alcohol in moderation is fine. Drunkenness is a sin that makes people like animals. But the Holy Spirit is the real deal.
