MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR:

In one of the daily Mass readings this week, Jesus is mad at people because the reject him. He is mad because they have been given by God what is needed to follow him and believe and yet they still don't.

"While still more people gathered in the crowd, Jesus said to them, 'This generation is an evil generation; it seeks a sign, but no sign will be given it, except the sign of Jonah. Just as Jonah became a sign to the Ninevites, so will the Son of Man be to this generation. At the judgment the queen of the south will rise with the men of this generation and she will condemn them, because she came from the ends of the earth to hear the wisdom of Solomon, and there is something greater than Solomon here. At the judgment the men of Nineveh will arise with this generation and condemn it, because at the preaching of Jonah they repented, and there is something greater than Jonah here.'" Luke 11:29-32.

Jesus is mad because those people from Nineveh were given less and did more with it. He is mad because the Queen of Sheba was given less and did more with it.

What do I mean? Both the Ninevites and the Queen of Sheba were folks from Old Testament times. And when they encountered God's preachers, they did something about it. Those folks knew way back then that what they were hearing was something unusual, and special. Then, Jesus comes along and preaches to people of his day, but they are not impressed. They reject what he has to say. And Jesus was way better than Jonah and Solomon!!! They should have been blown away!

God expects more, the more he gives someone.

We cannot simply say to ourselves, 'well I'm not too bad of a person, I never killed anyone.' I hear that often as to why we don't need to go to confession.

God does not measure all people with the same measuring stick. For some people, an inch on the measuring stick is actually 2 feet. And for others, an inch is really only 1 millimeter.

This may seem unfair; shouldn't God judge us all with the same measuring stick? Actually no, he does not. And the reason why is because everyone has a different expectation based on what God has already given them.

Now when I say that, I am not talking about financial success in life. I am talking about spiritual graces. God gives more faith to some and less to others. God gives more graces to some and less to others. This is because he has something he is expecting as a result of those gifts, he is expecting a return on his investment. If he invests 10 graces, he wants a payout on 10 graces. If he invests only 5, he will only want a payout on 5.

Hearing Jesus is more spiritual graces than hearing Solomon or Jonah. Jesus wasn't getting his return on investment and that made him upset.

So if you want to please Jesus, don't compare yourself to other people because you don't know how much grace they have been given in their lives. They may have been given less, in which case you'll always condemn them or just become lazy because you're comparing yourself to someone who couldn't possibly do you what God expects from you. Or they may have been given more, in which case you'll never measure up. Spend your time recognizing what God has given to you, and give him his return on investment. – Father Rossi
