Message from our Pastor:

Happy Advent!!! It's NOT Christmas yet (although I fully encourage you to say Merry Christmas to every person you meet – even if you happen to see Bill Maher on the street somewhere).

What is Advent? In Advent we have two things to focus on: one, that we get ready for the most important historical even that ever affected humanity, namely that God became a man and was born of woman; two, that we expect and excitedly await for God to come back into the world at some future date.

Get ready! How do we get ready? While many will shop, listen to Christmas music, wear reindeer antlers, etcetera, Christians will do these things (at least some of them) but through a different motivation. Christians might shop, but they will do so because they are spurred on by the generosity of God who *gave* his Son to us...so therefore we give to others. Christians will listen to Christmas music, not simply as the common background tune of the season, but with a prayerful consideration of the words of those songs that say "Oh come, oh come Emmanuel." Christians might wear reindeer antlers but that's just because they are goofy – no spiritual meaning. ©

Keep Christ in Christmas. Keep Christ in Advent. Everything the Christian does during the pre-Christmas season (Advent) is preparation for the great day of our salvation. We ask God to make our hearts a fitting place for the presence of His Son.

One of the most important ways we can make our heart a worthy place for this Infant is to go to Confession. Every single person in our pews has to go to confession this Advent...actually, you do not "have to," but it would be very good for you if you did. This is a special time of grace. We need the grace. Everyone needs the grace. Do not let Christmas come without having gone to receive the Sacrament of Confession.

We have an Advent reconciliation Service on December 15th at 6:30pm at St John where you can confess. We have confessions every Saturday before the Vigil Mass at St Pats and St John. We have confessions Monday-Friday at St Peter at 11:45am. There are confessions at every Catholic Church in Richmond. Google it. Every Catholic does have to go to confession at least once per year in order to receive Holy Communion or if they have committed a mortal sin...but it is also good to go very often...the Pope goes every week or two and so does pastor © Remember, everybody sins but only some confess.

Have a great Advent!!! Please let us know what we can do for you. Remember, we three priests exist for you and to help you in need. We are very imperfect, but we nonetheless have become priests to offer ourselves in your service for God. Do not hesitate to demand our attention when you or your loved ones has a need. You may have to be a little pushy because we sometimes have a thick skull.
