Message from our Pastor:

A few things today.

First, this is Guadete Sunday. It means 'rejoice.' You will see the priest wearing rose colored vestments as a sign of our subdued celebration and excitement for the coming of Christ at Christmas. We are still in the season of Advent. We are not in the Christmas season yet but we rejoice at what is coming to us on that great day. It is only a week or so away!!!

Second, a big thank you to all the staff and volunteers who have been doing so much to make our season so special. From the breakfasts with Santa, to the Our Lady of Guadalupe celebrations, to the decorating, to the Simbang Gabi celebration, to the Christmas concerts and all the other events that make this season so special. Thank you for your generous hearts!!

Finally, during Advent at each of the parishes, I have been preaching about one topic. I hope you remember what that topic is. It is CONFESSION. The sacrament of Reconciliation is the absolute best way to prepare spiritually for the grace that God is going to extend to us on Christmas day. If our hearts are hard because of sin (and remember, everyone sins), then the grace of Christmas will bounce off us like rubber against a stone. If we confess our sins it softens our hearts and makes room in them for God's presence. Remember, every Catholic has to go to confession at least one time per year (at least) and when conscious of a mortal sin BEFORE they can receive Holy Communion. And Advent is a great time to go. So GO. Especially if you have been away, I can absolutely promise you will feel so much better after you go. You will feel like a giant weight has been lifted off your shoulders. The longer it's been, the more it will feel like a weight has been removed. The bigger the sin you are afraid to confess, the more it will feel like a weight has been removed. Look in the bulletin for confession times or call any Catholic Church. No one can force you to go, it is your responsibility. Do you want to have a spiritually significant Christmas or just a material one?

Happy Advent. We have only a week left to prepare for Christmas. - Fr Rossi
