MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR:

Happy Advent! Happy New Year! We as a Church we begin a new year this Sunday with the start of Advent. Advent has two meanings.

First, we use it as a time of preparation for the great coming of Christ as an infant to Mary and Joseph at Christmas. And when I say preparation, I am not just talking about or even primarily talking about decorations, gifts, Christmas cookies or colorful lights. It is amazing people will stand in line for hours outside of a store to save \$100 on a TV but don't have time to worship God for an hour on Sunday.
