MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR:

Happy Feast day of Christ the King, King of the Universe!!!

I love that title. It is so triumphalistic, which I love. He is the only one who is worthy of that title. Jesus Christ is the only one worthy of being called King of the Universe because that is what he truly is. He is the King of everything. As the scripture says, 'every knee shall bend in heaven, on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord.' I like to think that it's good we kneel at Mass because we are just keeping our knee joints loose for the great day we kneel to our King in Heaven.

Here in America we are not used to thinking about having a king. We are a democracy where we elect people to represent us. The population basically chooses the direction of things. But for most of human history, this was not the case. During the majority of human history, people who governed and ruled by a monarch, by a king.

You probably recall the Old Testament readings about how the Jews, who were once governed by a number of Judges, decided that they wanted to be like the other surrounding nations and be led by a king. The prophet Samuel warned them about this and said it wouldn't turn out well for them because any person they appoint as king is going to be corrupted by the overwhelming power and authority. And the prophet was right.

And that's why we today, when we think of governing structures, why we hate the idea of having a king. We think about the king of England (George III) who we as a nation rebelled against in the American Revolution. Or we think about a bad king from ancient Egypt or a bad king or ruler in Asia. So we don't like the idea of having just one person who can say anything and order anything and is absolutely above reproach. We don't like the idea of having one person in change who has absolutely no one over them to keep an eye on them. We like democracy because we can vote out who we don't like.

But democracy is slow and full of bureaucracy. It has many problems. Many people do not even vote. And then when they vote they are ill informed or don't themselves know what is best for the country. And corruption and the corruptive influence of power is still fully alive in those elected...it's just that there are term limits and so they can be voted out...which is a good.

A monarchy is really the way to go. It is efficient. There's no debating. Things get done and they get done fast. The only problem is that, unless you have a true saint, who has perfect integrity, perfect intelligence, perfect wisdom and perfect discernment for justice, it's going to be a big problem.

The good news for the day is that not just our country, or other countries, or the whole planet earth...the good news is that the entire universe, every star, galaxy and solar system is ruled by one king, one monarch. He makes every decision as to the ultimate course of all events. There is nothing beyond his privy and nothing is too challenging for him to handle. He is perfectly above reproach. He is perfectly just in absolutely every decision. He is incorruptible and is perfectly wise. He is aware of all extenuating circumstances. His name is Jesus Christ. He is the king of the Universe. This is a great comfort to us. - Fr Rossi
