Message from our Pastor:

Are you ready for LENT!!!???!!!???

Lent begins this Wednesday, Ash Wednesday. Mass times and distribution of ashes are 9am St John, 12noon St Peter, 7pm St Patrick, and 7pm (Spanish) St John.

Lent is a great season. We all get a little out of shape, spiritually, and we all need a time where we all tighten the belt, spiritually. Lent is when we should indulge a little less in the pleasure of the world, we should pray a little (or hopefully a lot) more, and we should give a little extra money/time away to those in need and to our parish. It's good for us. Very good for us.

One of the things we are going to be focusing on this Lent, all three priests, is Confession. We especially want everyone to go to Confession this Lent. As such, we are making it easier for everyone by adding extra times when you can go to confession. We are going to have confessions available before and after every weekend Mass. So you have no excuse. It doesn't take long and you feel better after you go.

St Patrick – confessions Saturday before Mass as usual and after Mass; on Sunday confessions 30 minutes before and after the 1045am Mass

St John – confessions Saturday before Mass as usual and after Mass; confessions Sunday 30 minutes before and after the 9am and 1215pm Mass

St Peter – confessions Sunday before and after the 830am Mass and the 1045am Mass

Go! Go! Go!

Don't worry if it's been too long, or if you are worried about something you know you need to confess, or even if you don't think you need to go (just ask the priest and he will help you dig up your sins). All excuses.

Especially if it has been a long time, now is the time. You know not the day nor the hour when God will call you from this life. Be at peace whenever it does happen by making sure you are right with God.

A couple other reminders for Lent.

- 1. All Catholics 14 and older are obliged to abstain from meat on Fridays during Lent
- 2. All Catholics 18 to 59 years old are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting is eating only one meal the whole day (but you are allowed 2 small snacks is necessary).
- 3. All Catholics are encouraged to perform some other type of penance during Lent. Give up something you enjoy, add extra time to your prayer routine, give extra money away, etc.
- Lent is especially a time to focus on being better at whatever we are called to do given our state in life (i.e. take better care of our parents, be a better husband/wife, be more obedient to our parents, be a better priest).

Lent is a great time to push to be better. You can do more. Be better for your wife, be better for your husband, be better for your kids, be better for your parents. Be better mostly for Him who died for on the cross for you.
