Message from our Pastor:

October is a month of devotion to Mary, the Mother of God. In a special way the month is also devoted to the special prayer to Mary that we say as Catholics, the Rosary. In fact, the feast of the Holy Rosary is October 7th, which commemorates a great victory of Christians who were under attack by Turkish barbarians. In response to the threat, the Pope at that time encouraged all the faithful to pray the Rosary, the soldiers included, and invoke the intercession of Mary for protection. The Pope also had a vision of the victory that he expected because of Mary's protection. He was eventually informed that almost all of the 300 attacking Turkish ships were sunk or captured, a victory he quickly attributed to the prayers of Mary, granted through the faithful devotion of so many people praying the Rosary. He then declared October 7th, the day of the great naval battle, as the feast of Our Lady of Victory, also known as Our Lady of the Rosary.

If you do not believe God can work miracles in your life if you begin to faithfully pray the Rosary every day then you are in error. The Rosary is the single most powerful pray you can pray individually (the Mass is the most powerful prayer prayed as a Church).

If you have problems in your life, you need to start praying the Rosary every day. If you are sick, start praying the Rosary. If you are depressed, start praying the Rosary. If you are anxious or worried about something, start praying the Rosary. If your kids or

grandkids are in trouble and you worry about them, start praying the Rosary. If you are trying to stop a habitual sin, start praying the Rosary. If you want to be pure in heart, start praying the Rosary. If you don't know what is wrong, start praying the Rosary.

If you pray it every single day, I promise you that after praying it for one year your life will be so changed that at the end of the year you will be convinced of your need to pray it every single day for the rest of your life. That is a guarantee. Make the commitment. Make the sacrifice of time. It's your best use of time.

5. "Go to the Madonna. Love her! Always say the Rosary. Say it well. Say it as often as you can! Be souls of prayer. Never tire of praying, it is what is essential. Prayer shakes the Heart of God, it obtains necessary graces!" -St. Padre Pio
6. "The holy Rosary is a powerful weapon. Use it with confidence and you'll be amazed at the results." -St. Josemaria Escriva
7. "Say the Holy Rosary. Blessed be that monotony of Hail Mary's which purifies the monotony of your sins!" - St. Josemaria Escriva
8. "For those who use their intelligence and their study as a weapon, the Rosary is most effective. Because that apparently monotonous way of beseeching Our Lady as children do their Mother, can destroy every seed of vainglory and pride." – St. Josemaria Escriva
9. "You always leave the Rosary for later, and you end up not saying it at all because you are sleepy. If there is no other time, say it in the street without letting anybody notice it. It will, moreover, help you to have presence of God." – St. Josemaria Escriva

"The Rosary is a powerful weapon to put the demons to flight and to keep oneself from sin...If you desire peace in your hearts, in your homes, and in your country, assemble each evening to recite the Rosary. Let not even one day pass without saying it, no matter how burdened you may be with many cares and labors." – Pope Pius XI

"The rosary is the book of the blind, where souls see and there enact the greatest drama of love the world has ever known; it is the book of the simple, which initiates them into mysteries and knowledge more satisfying than the education of other men; it is the book of the aged, whose eyes close upon the shadow of this world, and open on the substance of the next. The power of the rosary is beyond description." – Archbishop Fulton Sheen
