Message from our Pastor:

The Bible says God knows your thoughts (first reading). Let me be sure you understand this. God knows all your thoughts. God knows ALL your thoughts.

Ouch. Every single thought you think, God knows about. It is as if you said every thought out loud on a roof top, that is how clearly God hears even the quickest of thoughts.

This is scary because everyone has awful thoughts. Everyone. Even priests...except your pastor of course...Everyone from pauper to pope, has awful thoughts.

There are a few things to understand regarding thoughts.

First, it is not a sin to have an evil thought, it is only a sin to entertain an evil thought. If you have a thought of anger or jealousy or arrogance or lust or judgmentalism, it is not a sin until you sort of keep it going by continuing to be convinced of it. But if you at that moment pray and desire to put that evil thought out of your mind, it will go away (eventually) and you can escape without being poisoned by the evil thought.

That is what God wants us to do. He knows we do not have control over thoughts. In fact, the Church teaches that the most common way temptation confronts us is through the introduction of evil thoughts. So it is part of the Christians battle. And God wants to see that we are fighting it.

Saints used to do all kind of things to change their evil thoughts, like snap a rubber band on their wrist, jump in a thorn bush, or walk with an uncooked bean in their shoe; little tricks to control thoughts.

The best way to control thoughts and push away evil thoughts is to, as much as possible, have a heart that is open to God and directed toward Him at every moment. This can be accomplished through simple interior prayer that you continue throughout your day. When you let the good in, the Holy Spirit, He pushes out the bad.

Don't get discouraged! Even though the battle is not complete until you take your last breath, it gives great meaning to every moment of your day. Realize that it is important for you, every moment of your life, to strive to accomplish holiness by letting God fill your thoughts - ALL your thoughts always. There is no room for boredom or meaninglessness in the mind and heart of a person who realizes the importance of every single thought of their life.

IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENT: I wanted to inform you of something very unfortunate that happened in one of our parishes. While cleaning the church, we found a host laying on the floor in the pews. It is likely that it was a consecrated host that someone walked back to their pew with and threw on the floor. This is a sacrilege and if done willingly is grounds for excommunication from the Church. Desecration of the Blessed Sacrament is one of the worst offences that can be committed because it is an offence against the Real Presence of Jesus Christ. I pray is was simply an accident and maybe a child who did not know what they were doing. A couple things: PARENTS need to watch their children to be sure they are consuming the host and that they do not try to receive Holy Communion unless they have had their First Holy Communion. EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS OF HOLY COMMUNION - if you are privileged enough to be able to help with the distribution of Holy Communion, then you need to observe every single person who comes up for Communion to be sure they consume the Host in front of you. No one is ever permitted to walk off with the Host. If they do, you need to stop them and ask them to either return the Host to you or consume it in front of you. I do this regularly and you need to as well if you want to have the honored responsibility of distributing Holy Communion. ALL PARISHIONERS - if you see someone walking away with a Host or someone in the pew with a Host then you need to say something to them. Do not be ashamed. Or walk up to the priest at that moment (not at the end of Mass) and tell the priest so he can deal with it. We must take it extremely seriously to care for and protect the Blessed Sacrament and it is everyone's responsibility. Thank you - Fr Rossi
