This past week marked the 18<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the terrible attacks on our nation on September 11, 2001. Do you remember where you were when you heard? Where were you when you watched on TV as those horrible planes flew into those buildings?

It was so terrible. It was amazing how in almost an instant life changed so much. The world almost stopped. People changed significantly, at least for a short time.

That event, and tragedy in general, has the effect of shaking people out of their routine way of thinking and causes them to contemplate some of the bigger questions in life. It gives clarity to thinking. In many instances it improves the thinking of people.

There is no way to know when something tragic may affect our lives. There is no way to know when our life here on earth will end or the lives of our loved ones.

But there is one thing that, when tragedy does strike, we will always be thankful that we did – confessed our sins and been reconciled to God.

Having felt the graces and reconciliation that comes about after making a good confession to God gives great peace to the heart that has faith. Confession is like preparation for tragedy. It is probably the best preparation for the unknown in life. And even knowing that our loved ones have been reconciled to God brings us peace. We know it is like a

protective shield around them and so when they have achieved their reconciliation, it brings us joy because we love them and want the best for them. It removes fear of the unknown.

So do not wait to go to confession. Do not hesitate. You have no idea what tomorrow will bring. But you will feel better taking it on after making a good confession.

#### Baby Bottle Campaign for East End Pregnancy Center.

St Patrick will participate in a Baby Bottle Campaign for the East End Pregnancy Center during the 40 Days for Life fall campaign from September 25 – November 3. The Baby Bottle Campaign is a fundraising effort for the East End Pregnancy Center which provides services free of charge and is funded only by donations.

Among the services they provide are pregnancy tests, ultrasounds to confirm pregnancy, parenting classes, mentoring, prayer and Gospel centered guidance for their patients.
