# Message from our Pastor:

Pope Francis recently told a group of American Bishops who were visiting him in Rome that abortion is a "preeminent priority" that needs the utmost attention.

The American Bishops also noted that during the visit the Pope was surprised to learn that over 60 million abortions have occurred in the United States since the 1973 Roe vs Wade decision legalized abortion.

This week hundreds of thousands went to Washington DC to tell lawmakers to protect life and stop the brutal killing of babies in the womb. This is the annual March for Life.

How wicked the scourge of abortion is on our country! It is by far the greatest evil in the world today. People scream and shout and are offended about everything today, most of which is extremely trivial. But very few are offended by the disgusting slaughter of innocent babies, which in nearly all cases is done for convenience sake. It is the killing of life for convenience.
