Message from our Pastor:

Happy Lent!!!

I do not say that sarcastically. Lent is a happy time. There is a special grace that only is given during Lent, and grace always makes us feel great!!!

Two important things of note today.

First, please, please, please make sure you go to confession during Lent!!! Every Catholic is required to go to confession at least once per year. But saying it is a requirement is like saying taking a shower is a requirement. Basically, it is part of a normal healthy spiritual life. If you are not sure what to confess, ask the priest to help you.

There will be a priest in the confessional 30 minutes before and 30 minutes after every weekend Mass. So there is no excuse. It is so easy. It takes a few minutes. If you understood the amount of grace and the spiritual impact it has for you to confess your sins and receive absolution you would be busting down the doors!

Second, I will be discussing the Bishop's Annual Appeal in the near future at each parish. Because it is the 200th anniversary of the Diocese (our Bicentennial), the Bishop has challenged us with a \$5 million goal in honor of the year. But don't worry, our parish isn't responsible for the whole \$5 million (hahaha).

That said I am asking humbly to please consider stretching yourself this year to give to the Annual Appeal, and to give a little more than you did last year. The Annual Appeal is how we pay for our seminarians to go to seminary, it is how we support retired priests, and it is how we pay for campus ministers who work at our Universities to help kids stay close to God while at college (not an easy task), among many other things. Please, please, please give generously!

I am praying for you all during this Lent. I hope it is a great one!

Answers to Frequently Asked Questions about Fasting & Abstinence:

Regulations for Fasting and Abstinence. Fasting is to be observed by all 18 years of age and older, who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. On a fast day one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed.

Regulations for Fasting and Abstinence. Abstinence is observed by all 14 years of age and older. On days of abstinence no meat is allowed. Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. When in doubt concerning fast and abstinence, the parish priest should be consulted. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence. All the Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence. Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer are the three traditional disciplines of Lent. The faithful and catechumens should undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for baptism or of renewal of baptism at Easter.
