One of my favorite passages from scripture is from the first reading this weekend in Jeremiah 31. It says, "I will place my law within their heart." It then goes on to discuss the ability for everyone to "know the Lord." If you've ever seen my license plate, that is what it is about. My license plate says "KNOWGD." Know God. Know Him.

I love that. Because I think it is the goal of the Christian life to KNOWGD. When we know someone, we are familiar with them. We can think like them, we can communicate with them easily and regularly. There is a familiarity.

God makes this possible because of how close He has decided to make Himself to us. How close? He is in fact inside of our hearts. That is how close He is. It does not get closer than that. And because He is so close, we all have the ability to discover His will for us and discern what He wants us to do on a regular basis. We can have a 'good life' that He sets for us, and avoid the sadness and self-destruction that can afflict the human condition as a result of bad choices.

He is our teacher, our savior, our guide, our Father, and He is so so very close to us!
