Dear parishioners,

I am writing this Parochial Vicar's Point of View (PVPV) from Harrisonburg as I attend our annual diocesan Priest Convocation. It has been a great blessing to be here with my fellow priests. By the time you read this, I will, God willing, be back in Richmond with many of you. Our speaker during this convocation is an excellent presenter and theologian, Dr. Ralph Martin, who is inspiring me to write a few words about what *all this* is all about. By "all this" I am referring to going to church, listening to the scriptures, receiving the Sacraments, living out the faith, etc. What is the point? What is *all this* about?

Well, I think in a very real way, *all this* is meant to help strengthen you, to help prepare you for the realities of life. Life out there is tough.
