Message from the Administrator's Desk:

Our Lady of Guadalupe Feast which is always celebrated by the Americas falls on 12th December and goes back to the 16th Century.

Juan Diego was a 51-year-old widower who lived in a small village near Mexico City. One Saturday morning on December 9, 1531, he was on his way walking by a hill called **Tepeyac** to attend mass in honor of our Lady, when he saw a radiant cloud appearing, and within it a young native American maiden was dressed like an Aztec princess who spoke to him in his own native language and sent him to the bishop of Mexico City, a Franciscan, to build a chapel in the place where the lady appeared. This is what she said to Diego; "My dearest son, I am the eternal Virgin Mary Mother of the true God, Author of Life, Creator of all and Lord of the Heavens and of the Earth...and it is my desire that a church be built here in this place for me, where, as your most merciful Mother and that of all your people, may show my loving clemency and the compassion that I bear to those who love and seek me."

The bishop eventually asked
Diego to have the Lady give him
a sign. At the same time, Diego's
uncle became seriously ill. The
Lady assured him that his uncle
would recover and provided
roses for Juan to carry to the

bishop in his cape or tilma. When Juan Diego opened his tilma in the bishop's presence, the roses fell to the ground and the bishop sank to his knees. On Juan Diego's tilma appeared an image of Mary, exactly as she had appeared at the hill of Tepeyac, it was December 12.

Mary's appearance to Juan Diego is a powerful reminder that Mary and the God who sent her, accept all peoples. Since then, it has become a very important Feast celebrated on the 12th day of December by the church especially in the Americas.

This is why the Hispanic
Community in the St. John
Church is Climaxing the
celebration today with a
procession of the image of the
Our Lady of Guadalupe, before
and after Mass so as to ask for
abundant blessings and
protection from the Lord.

Let us all join in the celebration, Happy Feast. - Fr. Maxwell.
