The Lord offers another chance to the sinner to repent.

As we are getting closer to the Easter Festivities, the highest point of our redemption, the love, mercy and forgiveness of the Lord is so much experienced, as He offers another chance to us to get closer to Him even in the midst of our sins. And this is clearly demonstrated in the gospel of John (8:1 - 11), showing how Jesus behaves with those who commit sins. Jesus turns the table on those who condemn the sinful woman when he says: "let the one who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." (Jn. 8:7) He is not condoning sin, but rather giving another chance to a sinner to make amends or repent of her sins or wrongdoing so that she is not condemned again the next time.

God does something new by extending his mercy and forgiveness to all. That is why Jesus concludes what happens in the scene by saying: "Has no one condemned you, woman? Neither do I condemn you, go and from now on do not sin anymore." Clearly it affirms what the Lord says through the prophet Ezekiel; "I do not desire the death of the sinner. but that he would return from his evil ways and live." (Ez. 8:23; 33:11). This is what the Lord requires from all of us during this Lenten period, which is coming to an end soon as we enter the fifth week, since each one has some cobwebs in his or her closet. How prepared are you to make amends so as to rejoice with the Lord at his resurrection? The choice is yours. - Fr. Maxwell
