Message from our Pastor

What is celebrated in Holy week?

Christ's passion begins with his messianic triumphant entry on a donkey (Zech. 9:9-10) into Jerusalem liturgically called Palm Sunday, to accomplish his paschal mystery (Mt. 21:1-11). Here, palms are blessed and waved in procession and later become holy objects or sacramentals to be used on Ash Wednesday the next year.

Three days into the Easter celebration, called Easter Triduum, begins the evening mass of the Lord's supper on Holy
Thursday, through Good Friday which emphasizes the saving value of the crucifixion to Easter vigil symbolized by the light of Christ, Easter candle, carried in procession in the dark night into Easter
Sunday to indicate Christ's victory over sin and death through his resurrection to life in which new Christians are welcome to Christ through baptism. By Christ's holy and glorious paschal mystery may the Lord guard and journey with us in this this holy week.
