Message from our Pastor

Dearly beloved,

Every Fourth Sunday of Easter is traditionally called Good Shepherd Sunday and Vocations Sunday because Jesus the Shepherd who cares for his sheep leads them to pasture (Ps. 23:2) and lays down his life for them (Jn. 10:11). The image of the Good Shepherd refers to the leadership role of Jesus to his flock indiscriminatingly, as he leads them to experience the joys of heaven and to live in eternity, just like every shepherd wholeheartedly leads the sheep to pasture. What is important is for the sheep to know, hear and follow the voice of their master.

This shepherding role has been entrusted to other groups of people with leadership roles to lead the flock. One of such groups are bishops. You will notice that a shepherd leads the sheep to pasture with a rod as a defensive weapon against wild animals, and his voice is always noticed, heard and followed. In much the same way, at his episcopal ordination, the bishop is given a **pastoral** staff with a curved top to indicate his pastoral authority or his symbol of office, and he holds it whenever he celebrates mass with the faithful as a sign of his pastorship/leadership role. Since he needs the collaboration of others in his diocese to help in this shepherding role, priests are ordained and appointed to serve as pastors in various parishes in the diocese as shepherds of the flock.

Hence, on this occasion, let us all pray fervently for vocations to the Priesthood and Religious life to fulfill the Lord's instruction to; "pray the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into his harvest" (Mt. 9:38; Lk. 10:2). Let us as well pray for the world Heads of States, Parents of Families and Managers of Institutions who assume leadership and shepherding roles.
