Message from Our Pastor

"Why don't you pray about it?" Is that not a line we hear often as Christians? What does it mean to take something to prayer?

We are children of God; He has made us to be in communication with Him. We can hear Him, and He consistently tries to communicate with us. How should we communicate with Him?

Be direct: Examples: "I thank you for 'x' because of 'y' that I realized is connected to why 'x is in my life, or 'why am I suffering because of 'x'"; "Give me peace today, because I am very anxious about "z".

Take time with the Lord and the issue you need to pray about. It can't simply be throwing a line, like the examples above, up to heaven. If someone tells me I am impatient, or indecisive, I should take it to the Lord at a time of prayer. Maybe I start my morning or evening offering with the accusation, "Lord, I was told today that I need to be more decisive in my decision making. I bring this to you during this time of prayer, speak to my heart, show me how to grow." Maybe He begins to speak to your heart through the Divine Office, reading of Sacred Scripture, or any number of other pious devotions. Maybe you keep bringing up the issue until He responds in a way that is clearly according to His purposes.

For years I had been praying that the Lord would free me from a feeling of "being stuck." My prayer seemed to be "help me to let go." Then, one day, I was eating lunch and found myself talking to the Lord and I simply said: "OK, I'm done running, free me from this." In that moment, without expecting anything, it was clear that this internal bondage was *gone*. Three days later we were closing churches because of the health crisis. The Lord

worked in my heart during that time according to his purposes. What about you?

Please be assured of my prayers this week.

Masses for The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary Tuesday August 15^{th.}

The Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary and is a holy day of obligation. When I was last a pastor, I regularly emphasized that holy days of obligation are holy days of opportunity. The Church sees in these days, doorways of grace, moments when we can separate ourselves from the "usual" and "remember" the central tenants of our faith and how the faith is meant to inform the rest of our lives, not the other way around. Let's ensure that we all come out to a Mass somewhere in the city, maybe take a risk and find a church you don't usually go to, if the Mass times in the cluster don't quite work with the strictness of your Tuesday schedule this year. In the Assumption, we see in Our Lady what we ourselves are meant for – the glorification of humanity in Christ.

She anticipates in her body, based on received *Previenent Grace*, what we receive in the sanctifying grace of Baptism, Confirmation, and the regular reception of the Sacrament of Reconciliation – directing us toward that blessed life that is anticipated in our daily efforts to remain close to our Lord.

From Our Pastor

Pastoral Council: Much gratitude goes out to those who have expressed interest in serving on pastoral council for the upcoming year. If there is still interest, please reach out to me in the next week or two, via email: bcapuano@richmonddiocese.org. In the meantime, I will take the names submitted so far to prayer and chat with some of the staff and make a determination how to expand or not moving forward. Whether or not we expand the pastoral council, please know you can always share your views and desires and I want to be receptive to how individuals and groups in our parishes would like to see things grow and develop.

Internal Updating: As mentioned previously, we have acquired the domain names "richomndcluster.org" and "richmondcluster.com". We will be migrating our email, websites, and calendaring to a new platform in the coming weeks. If you can share photos with me, that would be a big aid toward preparing for renewed communication in the cluster. We're also considering updating the bulletins and finding ways to provide consistent messaging on the weekend, as well as email communication, through platforms like FlockNotes and similar digital media. Schedules, Devotions, etc.: While I'm not quite ready to make adjustments to the liturgical schedule in the cluster, and at this stage, I am not really looking to make

changes, I am open to ideas and concerns that you may have within each of the three parishes. What do you need, or want? Are you open to, do you want, alternate daily Mass, confession, adoration times? Is there something about the current schedule that works, or does not work? What about formation opportunities for youth and adults? What are we missing in the community? How can we reconnect with folks who have not come back from the health crisis? These are all concerns to be addressed in pastoral council, but I also want to address broadly with you in the parish. Feel free to send me a note: bcapuano@richmonddiocese.org.

Community Garden: The success of the community garden at St. John has been really impressive, please stay tuned for an opportunity for a blessing and social time for the cluster parishes in the coming weeks.

St. Peter Block Party: Keep an eye on the bulletin for a Saturday in September/October for an opportunity to gather for fun & games at St. Peter.

Repute to the Church: As you probably know, through coordination with the St.

Patrick Festival and through a lot of hard work from parishioners, and in consultation with the Bishop, the parish was able to purchase one half of the duplex next to the Church (building on the left of the church as you face the front doors). Currently, we have neighbors residing in the top two floors, who will continue to provide rent payment to assist in the debt service, for at least the next year, based on current rental agreements. This will give us

time to discern how the building will be utilized and how we will cover costs into the future. The basement is currently accessible to the parish and is being rented as storage space for the St. Patrick's Festival. At present, we are anticipating forming a small group to assist in discerning how the house will be used moving forward. Painting and other projects: As you know, there are a couple painting projects that we need to finish up (the basement back wall, exterior of windows at the rectory). Hopefully we can finish these projects this summer, bids were coming in this week. Many thanks to our parishioners who are quietly working behind the scenes.

Fr. Redmond has been busy finding options for security measures around the Church. With the newly acquired duplex, I felt it was important to have "eyes on" the building, within reason. In the next couple of weeks, we'll be installing a couple cameras around the Church that will include the basement door access to the festival supplies, the side alley where there HVAC units are located, and the back alley near the handicap ramp.

I have a contact to provide some updates to the estimates to continue the restoration process for some of our stained-glass windows. From what I can tell, the windows are in good shape, but the frames and screens on some of the windows need to be addressed. More to come when we get some price quotes and can get a professional opinion on the condition of the windows themselves.
