Message from Our Pastor

The text from Isaiah this weekend may seem difficult to receive from the Lord. How could it be that Israel, imaged as a vineyard – could be given *everything* – only to have the Lord leave it for grazing, allowing the wall to be trampled, overgrown with thorns, and left to a drought? The answer is simple: The Lord looked for judgment and justice – but the people left him bloodshed and outcry.

So, a couple of reflection points:

In what way do you "cut and run" from the Lord, from others who are supposed to be among those you would consider "intimates" – men and women who *know* you. What would it take for you to be "exposed," or "real" before them?

What do you do more, complain or praise?

Challenge this week:

Have at least one *real* conversation with someone where you share your heart and invite them to do the same.

Take one moment when you find yourself complaining or expressing sarcasm, or criticism and turn it into praising the Lord and thanking him for one thing, to do reparation, to make up for, the complaint, sarcasm, or criticism.
