Message from Our Pastor

In the second reading this week, we hear from St. Paul's letter to the Philippians: In every circumstance and in all things I have learned the secret of being well fed and of going hungry, of living in abundance and of being in need.

I can do all things in him who strengthens me."

Of course, the focus is on the final phrase, Christ is the One who *strengthens us*. How is this the case? This week, we are reading from chapter four, in chapter 1 Paul says: "For to me, life is Christ and death is gain." Because He is *Source*, everything we need comes from Him.

When you look at your life, are you reliant on your own "reserves," or are you asking for specific kinds of grace by name? When you turn to the Lord, and "pray," don't just say "help me" or some version of that.

What specifically do you need? Be direct, be clear. Your prayer also should be: "help me with 'x."

What about "x"?

Instead, your prayer might be: "Lord, I can see I am at my end, give me patience in *this* task...in this upcoming conversation," or "Lord, I'm always sarcastic with this person, because I don't value their opinion and my sarcasm masks my disdain, help me to see their goodness, or their attempt to do what is right."

Notice the focus of the prayer, so that you and I can get at specific ways in which we might grow and rely upon Christ to give us everything we need.

Meeting Update:

A couple of weeks ago we had a meeting to begin discussions on the recently purchased duplex to the left of the Church. As you know, this purchase was secured through the assistance of the Irish Festival Committee. We have the next year to determine our next course of action, as we have tenants in both units on the second and third floors until at least next September. We are currently working on developing ideas for the good stewardship of the building and continuing conversations on the viability of developing a team of volunteers to establish an office and open-Church times at St. Patrick during the week. Construction projects: We are contracting with a local company to repair some plaster in the sanctuary around the windows and working to update some of the lighting in the sanctuary. Additionally, we are trying to secure bids to restore the front doors and the possibility of updating the sound system. As we are very tight in our weekly budget, we would benefit greatly from your financial generosity. The doors will cost anywhere from \$8000-\$10,000 and the sounds system might cost anywhere from \$10,000 - \$30,000. One step at a time, though, thank you in advance for your generosity.
