Join us for our Lessons and Carols Christmas Concert to be held on 12/3/23 at 3:00pm at St. John's. The Festival of Lessons and Carols is a service of Scripture and song that dates to the late 19th century. In this service, we listen to nine Scripture lessons which recount the Fall, the promise of a Messiah, the Incarnation, and the Great Commission to preach the Good News. Each lesson is followed by a carol or other song that reflects the lesson's message and a brief prayer.

Message from Our Pastor

In the first reading from the prophet Isaiah, we hear of Cyrus the Persian who was the ruler during the Babylonian captivity who pulled the Israelites from bondage. He was classed as a Messiah by the people.

We are used to thinking of those who serve as "liberators" as men and women on the same "side" as those oppressed. More specifically, we are used to seeing the Messiah as Christ Himself. That is clear, but so is the person of Cyrus, who was termed as "shepherd" (44:28), the "anointed" (45:1), which is also a metaphor for a "king" (Jeremiah 23:1-6; cf. 2 Samuel 5:2). These anointed ones were meant to lead, guide and protect the people.

What it suggests is that all things and all people can be used by the Lord in the life of grace to assist us in our process of sanctification. This week, look around your life and see what unique situations and circumstances you might turn "inside out" and consider in a new light. Might the Lord be using a unique moment (like He used the pagan King Cyrus) to help liberate you from some unique form of bondage in your life?

Liturgical ministry workshop: Thank you to everyone who was able to be present for the workshop. For those unable to attend, please see one of the priests or other ministers who benefited from the time to learn about Fr. Capuano's perspectives on the liturgy and how we will be adjusting our celebrations to draw more closely to the Lord and one another and to ensure we are all growing in our liturgical understanding of the Sacred Liturgy.

Looking for your input: A couple of weeks ago we had a meeting to begin discussions on the recently purchased duplex to the left of the Church. As you know, this purchase was secured through the assistance of the Irish Festival Committee. We have the next year to determine our next course of action, as we have tenants in both units on the second and third floors until at least next September. We are currently working on developing ideas for the good stewardship of the building and continuing conversations on the viability of developing a team of volunteers to establish an office and open-Church times at St. Patrick during the week. Construction projects: We are contracting with a local company to repair some plaster in the sanctuary around the windows and working to update some of the lighting in the sanctuary. Additionally, we are trying to secure bids to restore the front doors and the possibility of updating the sound system. As we are very tight in our weekly budget, we would benefit greatly from your financial generosity. The doors will cost anywhere from \$8000-\$10,000 and the sounds system might cost anywhere from \$10,000 - \$30,000. One step at a time, though, thank you in advance for your generosity. Fr.
