## Message from Our Pastor

In the Book of Exodus this week we hear the following: "If ever you wrong [the widow and orphan] and they cry out to me, I will surely hear their cry. My wrath will flare up, and I will kill you with the sword; then your own wives will be widows, and your children orphans." These are stark words.

State of the Parish: Thank you to all those who participated in our "State of the Parish" conversations that have provided an opportunity for you to hear from me and me to hear from you in a more casual way. Please consider how we might continue to grow our communities and provide additional formation for you in the Faith.

Looking for your input: A couple of weeks ago we had a meeting to begin discussions on the recently purchased duplex to the left of the Church. As you know, this purchase was secured through the assistance of the Irish Festival Committee. We have the next year to determine our next course of action, as we have tenants in both units on the second and third floors until at least next September. We are currently working on developing ideas for the good stewardship of the building and continuing conversations on the viability of developing a team of volunteers to establish an office and open-Church times at St. Patrick during the week. **Construction projects:** We are contracting with a local company to repair some plaster in the sanctuary around the windows and working to update some of the lighting in the sanctuary. Additionally, we are trying to secure bids to restore the front doors and the possibility of updating the sound system. As we are very tight in our weekly budget, we would benefit greatly from your financial generosity. The doors will cost anywhere from \$8000-\$10,000 and the sounds system might cost anywhere from \$10,000 - \$30,000. One step at a time, though, thank you in advance for your generosity. Fr.
