
This week, I challenge you to "see" how you are simply "surviving."

<u>Thank you</u>: Thank you to everyone who donated a turkey to St. Francis Home for their Thanksgiving dinner. We collected 22 turkeys weighing in around 375 pounds! The religious education children did a great job collecting shampoo, soap, body wash, lotion, and other items for residents.

Finances: You may or may not have noticed the weekly deficit to the budget. All three parishes rely on one another to ensure that we can manage costs, support staff, and keep doors open. St. Patrick is lagging behind and not pulling its weight. Without your generosity, we are not in a place to be able to keep the Church accessible to the faithful. Moving forward, we cannot assume that the Irish Festival contributions will continue. While the Festival is not going anywhere anytime soon, we cannot assume they will always have funding to support the parish and our various needs. We need to support ourselves. Recently the ice machine broke down, I do not have funding to fix it or replace it and we have had additional maintenance costs in other areas of the building. Without consistent commitments to the parish general offertory, we will be forced to pull funds from our endowments – this is not sustainable long-term. Please consider making a regular contribution to the general offertory through E-Giving. If you are already doing so, thank you for your generosity. Without our combined sacrifices, I will have to consider cutting efforts to grow the parish and will be forced to slow efforts to support needed restoration and maintenance of the buildings. For those not contributing anything, why not? For those who have made a commitment to E-Giving, have you reviewed your contribution? At one point in the past, I didn't review my own contributions to the Church for ten years, I could have been making adjustments for change in pay and inflation. If you don't regularly attend St. Patrick, but consider it home, please consider making a regular contribution to ensure we can keep this little parish open in the city. Stained Glass Window Update

We've finally received an update regarding the stained-glass windows. Two proposals have been offered: 1) maintain and provide new covers, without completing restoration of the last of the windows: \$98,844 – this is pretty reasonable in my experience; 2) Complete new covers to all windows, finish restoration of remaining windows: \$207,804. Please let me know your thoughts and concerns. At present, we can hold the project, but it will need to be addressed at some point in the next couple of years. – Fr. Capuano
