MUSIC AT SAINT PATRICK & SAINT JOHN

This week, we continue in Ordinary Time, the long stretch of Sundays, following the Solemnity of Pentecost, which will conclude right before Advent. Traditionally these were called Sundays after Pentecost and broken into sub-seasons. Saint Alcuin of York – a priest who wrote on the liturgy in the Carolingian Period – writes extensively about these subsections. It was not until the Missal of Pius V (which came out of the Council of Trent in 1570) that these subsections were compiled into the large season of “Sundays after Pentecost,” now known as Ordinary Time.

We continue to learn and use the Mass Ordinary [those mass parts which do not change, textually, but can change musically] from the Roman Missal, which is a combination of the Gregorian mass settings, Mass XVI and XVIII, in light of the recommendation from the USCCB’s *Sing to the Lord* which encourages us to learn this mass setting, specifically.

*The Lord addressed Job out of the storm*

The language in the first reading regarding the posture of the Lord toward Job is instructive. "Out of the storm," God speaks to Job. It is not just with a "still, small voice" that the Lord communicates with His loved ones. Often, He attempts to address our most significant concerns - in the midst of suffering. Are you listening? In effect, in the first reading the Lord reminds us to look *out*, to look *up*, to get a little perspective *beyond* our present sufferings to see that we are held in His Hands, that we are being prepared by His Mercy to take a small step forward in faith. It is an invitation to embrace our present suffering a little while, if even for just a moment, to see that He is at work. When you suffer, don't forget to *look around* and ask the Lord for direction, not to *avoid* suffering, but to allow the Lord to work through it.

Please be assured of my prayers this week. - Fr. Capuano
