THE PASTOR'S WEEKLY REFLECTION

What must I do to inherit eternal life?

What can we say about this weekend's Gospel? A man ran up to Jesus wanting to be confirmed in his own goodness... "Good teacher," he says... Our task as disciples is to never be satisfied with where we are in faith. Padre Pio once remarked that the spiritual life is like a ship in the water. FROM THE PASTOR

Pastoral Council: I'm very grateful to those who have responded thus far to the invitation to join the various pastoral councils for each of our parishes, a bit of a change from the last two years that saw a combined council for all three parishes. I appreciate your patience as I sift through the responses and attempt to set out for those who have volunteered various recommendations for meeting times that might fit our schedules. Additionally, I appreciate your patience and understanding as I juggle the various duties that often take me from the parishes on a regular basis. Please know that I will be reaching out soon to begin finding appropriate days and times when we might meet to reflect and serve our communities. I'm still open to others who might be interested in serving.

Consejo pastoral: Estoy muy agradecido a quienes han respondido hasta ahora a la invitación de unirse a los diversos consejos pastorales de cada una de nuestras parroquias, un pequeño cambio con respecto a los últimos dos años, cuando se contaba con un consejo combinado para las tres parroquias. Agradezco su paciencia mientras examino las respuestas e intento ofrecer a quienes se han ofrecido como voluntarios varias recomendaciones de horarios de reunión que puedan adaptarse a nuestros horarios. Además, agradezco su paciencia y comprensión mientras hago malabarismos con los diversos deberes que a menudo me alejan de las parroquias de manera regular. Tengan en cuenta que pronto me pondré en contacto con ustedes para comenzar a encontrar días y horarios apropiados en los que podamos reunirnos para reflexionar y servir a nuestras comunidades. Todavía estoy abierto a otras personas que puedan estar interesadas en servir.

Liturgical Training: We're anticipating offering training for current and new ushers, sacristans, lectors and extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion. Please keep an eye on the bulletin for upcoming opportunities.

Capacitación litúrgica: Estamos pensando en ofrecer capacitación para acomodadores, sacristanes, lectores y ministros extraordinarios de la Sagrada Comunión, tanto actuales como nuevos. Esté atento al boletín para conocer las próximas oportunidades.

Various projects and endeavors around the community: We're continuing the statue restoration project at Saint Peter and looking for assistance in cleaning the marble and restoring the altar rail and fixing the baptismal font (along with its relocation to is early 1900s location in the nave of the Church, all with the blessing of the Bishop. At Saint Patrick, we're working on bids to restore the front doors of the Church, and in the midst of a design for a dedicated confessional and we're beginning to get bids to repair the exterior and interior doors of the Church (as well as finalizing the refurbishment of the apartment we purchased a little over a year ago. At Saint John, I received the first set of draft renderings of the scope of work for the interior renewal of the Church. This past week, I submitted recommendations for tweaking the design.

I hope to present photos of the statue repair progress, sketches for the confessional and interior of the Saint John sanctuary soon. In regard to new work in the Churches, outside of *basic repairs*, my intention is always to pray, consult with staff and with the parish(es) at-large, reflect, and pray some more, and then make a decision on how to proceed. I'm *always* available to share what I'm thinking and have no intention of trying to force an agenda. I'm not a fan of campaigns, I'm more of a "pay-as-you-go" kind of guy. I'm grateful for your generosity and commitment to our parishes. Let's keep praying and working for the Lord. - Fr. Capuano

Music at Saint Patrick & Saint John

In the upcoming weeks, we'll dive deeper into what it means to "chant the Ordinary" of the Mass. First, a review of what "Ordinary" means. The Ordinary of the Mass are the texts that never change. These are "Lord have mercy" (Kyrie), "Glory to God" (Gloria), the Nicene Creed (Credo), "Holy, Holy, Holy" (Sanctus), "Lamb of God" (Agnus Dei), and the Dismissal (Ite Missa est). The church teaches, through Vatican II, that the chant mass parts from the Missal (a combination of the old chant mass XVI and XVIII) are to be taught to the Faithful—as a starting point in the musical development of the congregation—so that *participatio* actuoso (active participation) may be brought to its fullest-meaning, internal and external participation in the liturgy. Over the next few weeks, we'll dive into what the church says about the language in which we sing the Ordinary of the Mass. As a starting point, Sacrosanctum Concilium-the Vatican II document on the Sacred Liturgy-states "The use of the Latin language is to be preserved in the Latin rites" (No. 36).
