THE PASTOR'S WEEKLY REFLECTION

Thursday, October 10th is the birthday of Servant of God, Seminarian Frank Parater (died in 1920 in Rome). Following an early departure from the Priest Convocation to be held in Roanoke this year, I'll offer a Votive Mass in honor of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, at 12:05 PM at Saint Peter on Thursday, to plead for Frank's eventual beatification and canonization. Afterwards, I will be joined by a small homeschool group for lunch and then tours of Saint Peter and Saint Patrick.

Frank's motto was "The Sacred Heart never fails those who love Him." This is a clear invitation to ensure that all of us have a clear *affection* for our Lord, where we strive to serve him with zeal and express our love for Him through our daily encounters and commitments.

MUSIC AT SAINT PATRICK & SAINT JOHN

In the upcoming weeks, we'll dive deeper into what it means to "chant the Ordinary" of the Mass. First, a review of what "Ordinary" means. The Ordinary of the Mass are the texts that never change. These are "Lord have mercy" (Kyrie), "Glory to God" (Gloria), the Nicene Creed (Credo), "Holy, Holy, Holy" (Sanctus), "Lamb of God" (Agnus Dei), and the Dismissal (Ite Missa est). The church teaches, through Vatican II, that the chant mass parts from the Missal (a combination of the old chant mass XVI and XVIII) are to be taught to the Faithful—as a starting point in the musical development of the congregation—so that participatio actuoso (active participation) may be brought to its fullest—meaning, internal and external participation in the liturgy. Over the next few weeks, we'll dive into what the church says about the language in which we sing the Ordinary of the Mass. As a starting point, Sacrosanctum Concilium—the Vatican II document on the Sacred Liturgy-states "The use of the Latin language is to be preserved in the Latin rites" (No. 36).



Formation: We're starting up a formation session to assist the non-baptized, Catholics who need to receive sacraments, and those Catholics who need a refresher. Sessions will be held on periodic Sundays after the 8:30 AM Mass. The first meeting will be Sunday, October 6th in the parlor (to the left of the front doors of the Church). Assistance with linens: In order to attend to the Sacred Liturgy properly, we need assistance with cleaning and ironing altar linens and altar cloths on a periodic basis. Prior to a couple a months ago, Kris was doing the linens by herself. Assistance to keep the basics of the parish going is necessary.
