# THE PASTOR'S WEEKLY REFLECTION/ REFLEXIÓN SEMANAL DEL PASTOR

When we think about conversion, often, making a "sacrifice" is part of our starting over. Think of what we often consider at the start of the new year: we're going to exercise, go on a diet, cut out x, y, z...

As Christians, our starting point should not be the wider culture, but Christ Himself. Consider the second reading: Christ offers the *one* sacrifice. So our starting point in conversion, in starting again, should be *receiving* the love He offers, our common theological sonship. From there we take tentative steps in gratitude to change certain behaviors. When we falter, we go back to that place of being *received* in an eternal embrace by the Father. When we struggle with one of the Church's teaching, we go back to that first place of being loved by the Father in order to consider again how the teaching should be embraced.

I often counsel folks to use their imagination to give them that starting point. What would it look like to receive the Love of the Father. What do you *look like* when you accept the love of another? When you have that image, you can start again, no matter the sin you struggle with in your life.

Please be assured of my prayers this week.

Cuando pensamos en la conversión, a menudo, hacer un "sacrificio" es parte de nuestro nuevo comienzo. Pensemos en lo que a menudo consideramos al comienzo del nuevo año: vamos a hacer ejercicio, a ponernos a dieta, a eliminar tal o cual cosa...

Como cristianos, nuestro punto de partida no debería ser la cultura en general, sino Cristo mismo. Consideremos la segunda lectura: Cristo ofrece el único sacrificio. Por lo tanto, nuestro punto de partida en la conversión, en el nuevo comienzo, debería ser recibir el amor que Él ofrece, nuestra filiación teológica común. A partir de ahí, damos pasos tentativos en agradecimiento para cambiar ciertas conductas. Cuando flaqueamos, volvemos a ese lugar de ser recibidos en un abrazo eterno por el Padre. Cuando luchamos con una de las enseñanzas de la Iglesia, volvemos a ese primer lugar de ser amados por el Padre para considerar nuevamente cómo debe ser aceptada esa enseñanza.

A menudo aconsejo a las personas que usen su imaginación para darles ese punto de partida. ¿Cómo sería recibir el Amor del Padre? ¿Cómo te ves cuando aceptas el amor de otro? Cuando tengas esa imagen, podrás empezar de nuevo, sin importar el pecado con el que luches en tu vida.

Ten la seguridad de que esta semana puedo orar por ti.

# MUSIC AT SAINT PATRICK & SAINT JOHN

This past Thursday, we celebrated the All Hallows Eve Vigil at Saint Patrick, followed by a procession around the block. Much of the service was chanted in latin. Even if you could not attend, the service—as a part of the liturgical life of the cluster, and the upcoming Vespers services in December at Saint Patrick—presents a good opportunity to reflect on participatio actuoso [active participation]. Openly and actively listening to the latin parts that are unfamiliar as well as singing the simpler tones [ex. the Psalm tones that are short and repetitive] are ways in which we can begin engaging in these latinenglish bilingual liturgies with chant that may not be familiar. Active participation is an inward and outward sign of worship to God. The word "liturgy" derives from the Greek *leitourgia*, which means work. Singing, reading, serving, laundering the linens, setting up for Mass, making the floral arrangements – all these endeavors take work on the part of the people as well as the parish priest. What is the goal or the raison d'être? In humility, we come to commune with Christ. In love, we give praise and worship to God, in response to what he asks of us throughout the Psalms. In union with the Body of Christ, we share a "common purpose of knowing, loving, and serving God" (Good Music, Sacred Music, and Silence, Kwasniewski). In other words, when we are generous with the Lord, he is generous with us!
