Fr. Danny Cogut, pastor of Our Lady of Perpetual Help, Salem, and former vicar here in our parishes provided a note to his parishioners this past week. We include it here, so that you might consider offering prayer and support

As many of you know, a couple weeks ago I was in the hospital for a couple days for anemia. It turns out that the reason for it was that they found cancer in my stomach, and possibly my liver. Obviously, this came as a great shock to me and my family-as I'm sure it does for you all.

I plan on getting treatment in Richmond, to be with my parents. There are still lots of unknowns about the prognosis and treatment options, but I've asked Bishop Knestout for a medical leave of absence starting Monday, December 16. He has graciously offered to appoint a temporary priest-administrator of OLPH for the duration of my treatment, which may take several months. We don't know who that will be yet (as of the time of this writing), but hopefully it will be announced soon. God willing, I'll be able to return after the treatment.

I know this will seem like *deja vu* for many of you, with the illnesses of our previous pastors (as it does for me and my family, with my sister). I'll be asking for the intercession of our dear Servant of God Frank Parater [www.frankparater.org] for healing, and I humbly ask you all to do the same. Frank was a Richmond seminarian, a graduate of Benedictine, and an Eagle Scout, who died in Rome from rheumatic fever at the age of 22. Perhaps we'll make him a saint!

MUSIC AT SAINT PATRICK & SAINT JOHN

Today, on this the third Sunday of Advent—also known as Gaudete, or Rejoice, Sunday—the choirs of Sts John and Patrick will offer a liturgical service of **Nine Lessons and Carols**. As the name suggests, the service includes nine lessons (scriptural readings) and nine carols (i.e. hymns and choral pieces of music), incrementally bringing us through the season of Advent into the season of Christmas. The first few readings focus on the fall and original sin in Genesis, then move to the promise of a Savior in Isaiah, and finally bring us to the story of the birth of Jesus in various Gospel accounts. Each carol that follows is meant to be a musical meditation on the reading that preceded. There will be some carols sung by congregation and some will be sung by the choir alone. 

The design concept for Saint John has taken longer than expected. After a fair amount of back-and-forth, the included images are available for your comments and reflections.

For The Pro-Cathedral of Saint Peter, we provided a design that was created as a needlepoint for the celebrant chair in the sanctuary. For Saint Patrick, we redesigned the traditional Celtic Cross, with some modifications that make it unique for our parish.

For Saint John the Evangelist, we started with the image on the front of the bulletin that Fr. Rossi swiped from the internet and focused the image on two elements that are connected to Saint John, the Eagle, which represents the Fourth Gospel and the Chalice, which represents the legend that he was once presented with a poisoned chalice, after drinking the contents, he was unharmed.


