**THE PASTOR'S WEEKLY REFLECTION/

As we anticipate the beginning of the Lenten season, I commit to your prayers our catechumens and our candidates for Full Communion. This is a unique time of year as they anticipate Easter Sacraments and begin a deeper journey into the life of Faith.

Additionally, I invite you to consider how you might participate further in the faith and make a commitment to be more deliberate about your life as a disciple and your commitment to the spiritual and corporal works of mercy:

**The corporal works of mercy:** To feed the hungry; To give drink to the thirsty; To clothe the naked; To shelter the homeless; To visit the sick; To ransom the captive; To bury the dead.

**The spiritual works of mercy:** To instruct the ignorant; To counsel the doubtful; To admonish sinners; To bear wrongs patiently; To forgive offenses willingly; To comfort the afflicted; To pray for the living and the dead.

Among the many social and moral issues that are publicly noted today, we have unique opportunities in our parishes to alleviate suffering, how might you get involve or encourage others to contribute time and resources to those in need?

Please be assured of my prayers this week.

**Fiscal Year 2024-25 Dedicated Contributions:**

Now that all 3 financial statement on the fiscal health of our parishes have been presented, I thought it appropriate to address a couple points for your consideration.

We often speak about "social ministry." Does that mean "hospitality," like what happens after the 8:30 AM Mass at Saint Peter, or after the 10:45 AM Mass at Saint Patrick, or does it mean assistance to the poor?

As Catholics, we strive to do both: hospitality and physical social aid. In my mind, "social ministry" is direct aid to the poor. "Hospitality" is support to various events in our parishes: Dinners, doughnuts after Mass, etc.

We're working to update our online giving platforms in all three parishes to more accurately reflect what we are inviting your contributions to support. If you see something that needs updating or refinement, please let me know.

As we grow our offerings in the community, my hope is to establish networks in the community, so that I am not the sole arbiter to determine whether funding is extended for hospitality, trips, or material aid for the poor. **MUSIC AT SAINT PATRICK AND SAINT JOHN**

Continuing in our discussion of the Order of Mass, the Liturgy of the Word follows the Introductory Rites. The First Reading, Psalm, and Second Reading start off this part of the Mass. These readings, as well as the Gospel, are on a three-year cycle. Every three years the readings are the same. The Second Reading only occurs on Sundays and Solemnities. The Responsorial Psalm may be replaced by the earlier Gradual. The Gradual is a smaller snippet of the psalm [usually two or three verses, instead of the Responsorial Psalm five or six] and is a very elaborate chant with many notes and a wide vocal range.

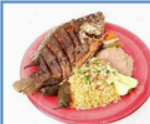
