**THE PASTOR'S WEEKLY REFLECTION/
REFLEXIÓN SEMANAL DEL PÁRROCO**

Earth and Heaven

There is a temptation in the life of the Church that is emphasized somewhat by the second reading. It is easy to make a distinction between the physical and the spiritual, to contrast them and put one on a pedestal, over the other. In the reading we have the *first* man who was flesh, the *second* man who is spirit. While one might read St. Paul's words as the Lord preferring spirit over flesh, the proper orientation is that Christ has come to *wed* the spiritual and physical. He wants the two to interpenetrate one another, so that there might not be a distinction between the two, but one life, one free expression where our wills are united with His. Notice the last line of the reading. We are born in the flesh with one "image" and then, as a result of the grace of the sacraments, we *add* on another "image." We should see this "image" like the wax seal of an official document. The image of the love of the Father is imprinted upon our souls, that we might *remain* with Him, that we might live in and through Him.

Hay una tentación en la vida de la Iglesia que se enfatiza un poco en la segunda lectura. Es fácil hacer una distinción entre lo físico y lo espiritual, contrastarlos y poner uno en un pedestal sobre el otro. En la lectura tenemos al primer hombre que era carne, el segundo hombre que es espíritu. Si bien uno podría leer las palabras de San Pablo como que el Señor prefiere el espíritu sobre la carne, la orientación adecuada es que Cristo ha venido a casar lo espiritual y lo físico. Él quiere que los dos se compenetren entre sí, de modo que no haya una distinción entre los dos, sino una vida, una expresión libre donde nuestras voluntades estén unidas a la Suya. Observe la última línea de la lectura. Nacemos en la carne con una "imagen" y luego, como resultado de la gracia de los sacramentos, agregamos otra "imagen". Deberíamos ver esta "imagen" como el sello de cera de un documento oficial. La imagen del amor del Padre está impresa en nuestras almas, para que podamos permanecer con Él, para que podamos vivir en y a través de Él.

After consultation with the Pastoral & Finance Councils, and working with a contractor, we're in the midst of building a 3-bay confessional that will be located at the back of the church, to ensure privacy and confidentiality, and to free up appropriate space in the sacristy to the left of the sanctuary.
