THE PASTOR'S WEEKLY REFLECTION/ REFLEXIÓN SEMANAL DEL PÁRROCO

As we enter into the most solemn liturgical week of the year, I encourage you to take advantage of the celebrations of Holy Week and attempt pause, where realistic, the usual activities of daily life.

Taking time to make the Lord the most central relationship of your life will enable you to reevaluate priorities and consider how you and I tend to place significant obstacles in front of our spiritual growth.

Palm Sunday - the Triumphant entry of the King of Kings into the City of Jerusalem

Chrism Mass (Monday) - the consecration and blessing of holy oils for the new year and the renewal of the priestly promises

Holy Thursday - the celebration of the Institution of the Most Holy Eucharist and the commitment to service after the pattern of the Lord. This night includes adoration before the Altar of Repose, liturgically joining with the Lord at the Garden of Gethsemane.

Good Friday - the celebration of the Lord's Passion and the adoration of the Cross, the symbol of our salvation through Christ.

Holy Saturday - the celebration of the Lord's descent to reclaim the dead, and the solemn celebration of the Easter Vigil in which the Elect are baptized and Christians are brought into full communion with the Catholic Church

Easter Sunday - the yearly celebration of Christ's triumph of sin and death and the renewal of our baptismal promises to live fully for Christ and His Church.

Please be assured of my prayers this week.

Viernes Santo: la celebración de la Pasión del Señor y la adoración de la Cruz, símbolo de nuestra salvación por medio de Cristo.

Sábado Santo: la celebración del descenso del Señor para rescatar a los muertos y la solemne celebración de la Vigilia Pascual, en la que los elegidos son bautizados y los cristianos entran en plena comunión con la Iglesia Católica.

Domingo de Pascua: la celebración anual del triunfo de Cristo sobre el pecado y la muerte, y la renovación de nuestras promesas bautismales de vivir plenamente para Cristo y su Iglesia.

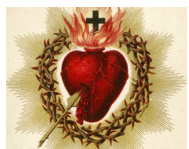
MUSIC AT SAINT PATRICK AND SAINT JOHN

Throughout the liturgies of Holy Week, we see additions of silence interspersed within singing and recitation. The liturgy is the “source and end of all prayer; time devoted to the Eucharist and Divine Office can gradually transform our whole life into a liturgy” (Fr. Jacques Philippe, Prayer: Oxygen for the Soul). In the Mass and in Vespers (Evening Prayer, which has been prayed each week of Lent at St. Patrick on Wednesdays at 6p), the spoken responses, the sung texts are given to us and our minds must catch up to the action of singing or speaking, through silence. Singing is transformative, internally. Benedict XVI says, “Singing itself is almost like flying, rising up to God; it is in some way an anticipation of eternity.” On the other side, moments of silence are taken in the Mass and at Vespers to allow our minds (mens) to coincide with our voice (vox). In Sacrosanctum Concilium—the Second Vatican document on the liturgy—we find the liturgy, which literally means the “work of God,”—to be “the work [through which] our redemption is accomplished” (SC 2). Fr. Jacques Philippe also says that “Authentic liturgy always bears fruit beyond itself.” May we allow the liturgy to transform our lives this week and inspire us with confidence in our Savior!

This is the annual Mass where the priests renew their promises and the bishop blesses and consecrates the holy oils (Oil of the Infirm [Anointing of the Sick], Oil of the Catechumens [for those to be baptized], Sacred Chrism [for Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Orders]).

Holy Thursday, April 17th

Mass of the Lord's Supper/ Misa de la Cena del Señor

This is the Mass commemorating the institution of the Most Holy Eucharist and the institution of the Sacred Priesthood, the Mandatum (Washing of the Feet) is traditionally offered following the homily.

4:00 PM (Saint Peter) | 6:00 PM (Saint Patrick) | 7:00 PM (Saint John/San Juan).

Following the conclusion of Mass, the Blessed Sacrament will be processed, in all three parishes, to an altar of repose for a time of adoration.

Good Friday, April 18th

According to ancient tradition, Mass is forbidden on this day. Instead, there is a Liturgy of the Word, Adoration of the Most Holy Cross and Distribution of Holy Communion.

Holy Saturday, April 19th

The morning of Holy Saturday commemorates the period of the Lord's "descent into hell" as noted in the Apostle's Creed, it marks the death of the Lord and anticipates the resurrection. In the evening, we "vigil" in anticipation of the Resurrection and the Easter Sacraments.
