THE PASTOR’S WEEKLY REFLECTION/ REFLEXIÓN SEMANAL DEL PÁRROCO

de mortis regno

In the third scrutiny prayed over the Elect this weekend, we pray for the gift of life so that they may be saved *de mortis regno*, from the *kingdom of death*. This evocation from the heart of the Church should cause the mind to turn to a parallel found elsewhere in the pious inheritance of Marian theology, the “veil of tears” noted in the great Marian antiphon the *Salve Regina*.

The Resurrection of Christ is a gift offered to each of us to be unpacked - that it might stand starkly against the backdrop of so much in our world that leads to a “culture of death.” We’re so used to being impacted by the consequences of sin that we too easily ignore our venial, simple, sins, often excusing them as having little impact on our daily lives.

This week, let’s ask for a renewed vision to be aware of where we allow the “kingdom of death” to pervade our outlook and how it can disincite us from the virtue of hope and the possibility of a true restoration of the gift of life offered by Our Lord.

En el tercer escrutinio que se reza sobre los Elegidos este fin de semana, pedimos el don de la vida para que sean salvados *de mortis regno*, del reino de la muerte. Esta evocación desde el corazón de la Iglesia debería llevarnos a un paralelo que encontramos en otras partes de la piadosa herencia de la teología mariana: el "velo de lágrimas" mencionado en la gran antífona mariana, la *Salve Regina*.

La Resurrección de Cristo es un don que se nos ofrece a cada uno para que lo analicemos, para que se destaque con claridad en el contexto de tantas cosas en nuestro mundo que conducen a una "cultura de la muerte". Estamos tan acostumbrados a ser impactados por las consecuencias del pecado que ignoramos con demasiada facilidad nuestros pecados veniales, simples, y a menudo los excusamos por tener poco impacto en nuestra vida diaria.

Esta semana, pidamos una visión renovada para ser conscientes de dónde permitimos que el "reino de la muerte" invada nuestra perspectiva y cómo puede apartarnos de la virtud de la esperanza y de la posibilidad de una verdadera restauración del don de la vida que nos ofrece Nuestro Señor.

Blessing of Easter Baskets

We hope you can join us!

MUSIC AT SAINT PATRICK AND SAINT JOHN

Continuing in our discussion of the Order of Mass, the final sections of the Mass include Communion, Prayer after Communion, and the Concluding Rites [Blessing & Dismissal]. The first option in the General Instruction of the Roman Missal for singing at Communion is, “the antiphon from the Missal.” This antiphon, plus the accompanying Psalm, which textually meditates on the theme of the antiphon, is sung by the choir alone. It may be sung by the people and the congregation. At our parishes, if we printed a program each week for Mass, we might become in the practice of the congregation singing the antiphon with the choir. The text of the Communion antiphon is almost always a quotation from the Gospel of the day, continuing the themes and motifs of the liturgy, and functioning to connect the Liturgy of the Word to the Liturgy of the Eucharist. “When the distribution of Communion is over, if appropriate, the Priest and faithful *pray quietly for some time*. If desired, a hymn may be sung” (GIRM No. 88).

Mass of the Lord's Supper/ Misa de la Cena del Señor

This is the Mass commemorating the institution of the Most Holy Eucharist and the institution of the Sacred Priesthood, the Mandatum (Washing of the Feet) is traditionally offered following the homily.

4:00 PM (Saint Peter) | 6:00 PM (Saint Patrick) | 7:00 PM (Saint John/San Juan).

Following the conclusion of Mass, the Blessed Sacrament will be processed, in all three parishes, to an altar of repose for a time of adoration.

In the evening, we "vigil" in anticipation of the Resurrection and the Easter Sacraments. The evening Mass is marked by the Easter Fire, blessing of the Paschal Candle, extend Vigil readings, and the celebration of the Sacraments of Initiation.
